Program Implementation

- Funded by the State Legislature through the Solid Waste Management Trust Fund.
- Our program was initially funded as a pilot project in 1995 for lead arsenate collection and disposal (70,000 lbs.).
- We were funded again in 1996-1997 to hold pilot project for Ag-use pesticides and container collection and disposal in 4 selected counties (52,000 lbs.).

Program Implementation

- A statewide program has been funded since 1997.
- The Funds are given to the Florida Dept. of Environmental Protection and from there, funding and spending authority is transferred to the Florida Dept. of Agriculture & Consumer Services.
