 Actually, in my opinion, the biggest disadvantages of pesticide recordkeeping come to those who are not recording all of their applications and not keeping additional elements in their application record.

 Don't just keep records of your Restricted Use
 Pesticide applications –
 keep records of all of your pesticide applications.

 Keep additional record elements for YOU, ones that allow you to manage your pesticides, and your pests, better.

 Keep three identifiers for every pesticide you use – you will always be in compliance with the regs.

- The Product or Brand (Trade) name
- The Common Chemical name of the active ingredient
- The EPA Registration No.
- They're all on the label!

- Spray pressure
- Nozzle type, size
- Nozzle spacing
- Boom height

- Tractor speed or RPMs
- Other pertinent equipment settings
- Amount of water used
- Tank mix/adjuvants

- Crop information
  - Crop stage (vegetative, reproductive, height, etc.)
  - Planting date and/or predicted days to harvest
  - Irrigation information

- Weather information
  - Recent rainfall amount
  - Temperature
  - Heat unit (day degree) info
  - Wind speed (anemometer)

- Pest density (insects or weeds)
- Other pests (insects or weeds)
- Beneficial insects?

- Anything unusual during the application.
  - Equipment problems
  - Exposures; who, how

- Restrictions
  - Buffers, set backs on label
  - Wind speeds
  - Materials, rates on soil type.

- Evaluate effectiveness of your control efforts
  - Comparison of strategies
  - Rates
  - How applied

- Trouble shoot problems, control failures
  - Phytotoxicity
  - Spotty control
  - Lack of control
  - Resistance?

 Resistance management now may be one of the most important aspects of recordkeeping.

 Documentation of pest response to control efforts.

- Manage your purchase of pesticides.
  - Buying only what you need
  - Work to eliminate disposal of unwanted materials

- Better crop rotation decisions
  - Plant-back restrictions
  - Past pest problems

Carry-over injury issues.

- Documents your proper, legal use of pesticides.
  - Injuries/exposures
  - Drift
- NOT having records is not a good defense!

- Ability to provide needed information in a medical emergency
  - A requirement
  - Just a good idea

- Public concerns documents your use of pesticides
  - Document reduced use
  - Document alternate materials
  - Document necessary use

 Ability to contribute data to needs information for pesticide regulatory decisions.

- Some day you may sell the farm...
  - Lending institutions want to know...
    - Some lending institutions NOT making loans on agricultural land.

- Sporadic pests they come and go...
  - what did you use?
  - what rate did you use?
  - how did it work?
  - can you still use it?!

- Sporadic pests they come and go...
  - Lets you do a repeat performance of a good job

- Who applies, has applied pesticides on your operation?
- Who might in the future?
- Memories...

- Resistance management
- Trouble-shot problems
- Repeat successes
- Contribute information for regulatory decisions
- Emergency information
- History for purchase loans

Keep them forever!
