Mode of Action

Each of the components in TwinLine provides a different mode of action against plant pathogenic fungi. Pyradiostrobin belongs to the group of respiration inhibitors dassified by the US EPA and Canada PMRA as Cuinone Outside Inhibitors (QoI) or target site of action Group 11 fungicides. Cleaning before refilling is the responsibility of the refiller.

Triple rinse as follows: To clean the container before final disposal, empty the remaining contents from this container into application equipment or mix tank. Fill the container about 10% full with water. Agitate vigorously or recirculate water with the pump for 2 minutes. Pour or pump rinsate into application equipment or rinsate collection system. Repeat this rinsing procedure two more times. Dispose of rinsate in compliance with state and local regulations for pesticide products.
