State collection programs provide a way to reduce the cost of recycling.

Consolidation of multiple registrant's tanks and multiple retail locations drive efficiency in logistics and processing.

Financial participation by retailers provides funding for tanks that can not be assigned to a sponsoring registrant.



## **State Collection Programs**

In 2010 we estimated that there could be as many as 500,000 obsolete tanks that would need recycling.

Initial evaluation of state collections is typically 2 – 3 x the actual collection volumes.

Soon after the conclusion of a 2011 state program a dealer requested assistance in recycling 400+ mini-bulks.

Last year there were state collection programs in mid-west states that collected less than 1000 tanks.



## **State Collection Programs**

Why are we not collecting more tanks in these programs?

- Is our view of the need for tank recycling wrong?
- Are low cost recycle brokers "buying" tanks?
- Is this a timing issue?
- Do we need to do a better job of promoting the programs?
- Does the participation fee, and the requirement to clean tanks reduce participation?
